

## 2 Peter 2—STAND FIRM IN SOUND DOCTRINE

1 Peter 1—Stand firm in <u>victory</u> 1 Peter 2—Stand firm in your <u>identity</u> 1 Peter 3—Stand firm in your relationships 1 Peter 4—Stand firm in your faith

1 Peter 5—Stand firm against your <u>adversary</u> 2 Peter 1—Stand firm in the <u>provision</u> of God

1<sup>st</sup> Peter gives **<u>encouragement</u>** against outside persecution.

2<sup>nd</sup> Peter warns against inside corruption.

**Corruption abounds when the Word of God** is not the centerpiece of the church's function. To combat the problem of <u>heresy</u>, Peter reaffirmed the <u>foundation</u> of Holy Scripture. Second Peter is written to combat **false teaching** in the church.

Second Peter stresses the importance of <u>knowledge</u> using a form of that word 12 times. Second Peter validates the <u>inspiration</u> of scripture.

"Peter wrote this (second) letter to remind believers of the <u>source of sound doctrine</u>, to encourage <u>diligence in faith</u>, to strengthen <u>biblical foundations of beliefs and practices</u>." Swindoll Second Peter chapter 2 warns against false teachers who lead others astray.

Second Peter 2 is probably not on anyone's favorite chapter list, but it is an important word for every believer.

## 1. False teachers Focus on the Sensual; not the Spiritual

**2 Peter 2:1–3a (NIV84)** <sup>1</sup> But there were also <u>false prophets among</u> the people, just as there will be <u>false</u> <u>teachers</u> among you. They will <u>secretly introduce destructive heresies</u>, <u>even denying the sovereign Lord</u> who bought them—bringing swift destruction on themselves. <sup>2</sup> <u>Many will follow</u> their <u>shameful ways</u> and will <u>bring the way of truth into disrepute</u>. <sup>3</sup> In their <u>greed</u> these teachers will <u>exploit</u> you with <u>stories they have</u> <u>made up.</u>

**2** Peter 2:17–21 (NIV84) <sup>17</sup> These men are <u>springs without water</u> and <u>mists driven by a storm</u>. Blackest darkness is reserved for them. <sup>18</sup> For they mouth <u>empty</u>, <u>boastful words</u> and, by <u>appealing to the lustful</u> <u>desires of sinful human nature, they entice people</u> who are just escaping from those who live in error. <sup>19</sup> They <u>promise them freedom</u>, while <u>they themselves are slaves of depravity</u>—for a man is a slave to whatever has mastered him. <sup>20</sup> If they have escaped the corruption of the world by knowing our Lord and Savior Jesus <u>Christ</u> and are <u>again entangled</u> in it and overcome (by the sin), <u>they are worse off</u> at the end than they were at the beginning. <sup>21</sup> It would have been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than to have known it and then to turn their backs on the sacred command that was passed on to them.

- 1. The warning is against those who are on the **inside** and lead people astray. What damage they cause to God's Kingdom.
- 2. False teachers are often engaging, entertaining, appealing (none of which is wrong) but <u>lack</u> authenticity, integrity, and conviction.

- 3. False teachers market heresy. Other options
- 4. False teachers are more concerned with **appearance** than **substance**.
- 5. False teachers **<u>exploit</u>** others with <u>**deceitful**</u> words.
- 6. False teachers are filled with **greed**.
- 7. False teachers are **morally and spiritually corrupt** –evil.
- 8. False teachers focus on the *rhetorical*—more about *style* than *substance*

## 2. False Teachers will be Punished by God

2 Peter 2:3b–11 (NIV84) <sup>3b</sup> .... Their <u>condemnation has long been hanging over the</u>m, and <u>their destruction</u> has not been sleeping. <sup>4</sup> For if <u>God did not spare angels when they sinned</u>, <u>but sent them to hell</u>, <u>putting</u> <u>them into gloomy dungeons to be held for judgment</u>; <sup>5</sup> if he did not spare the ancient world when he brought the flood on its ungodly people, but protected Noah, a preacher of righteousness, and seven others; <sup>6</sup> if <u>he</u> <u>condemned the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah by burning them to ashes</u>, and <u>made them an example of</u> <u>what is going to happen to the ungodly</u>; <sup>7</sup> and if he rescued Lot, a righteous man, who was distressed by the filthy lives of lawless men <sup>8</sup> (for that righteous man, living among them day after day, was tormented in his righteous soul by the lawless deeds he saw and heard)— <sup>9</sup> if this is so, then the Lord knows how to rescue godly men from trials and to hold the unrighteous for the day of judgment, while continuing their punishment. <sup>10</sup> This is especially true of those who <u>follow the corrupt desire of the sinful nature</u> and <u>despise authority</u>. <u>Bold</u> and <u>arrogant</u>, these men are not afraid to slander celestial beings; <sup>11</sup> yet even angels, although they are stronger and more powerful, do not bring slanderous accusations against such beings in the presence of the Lord.

- 1. God <u>condemns</u> the wicked.
- 2. God **preserves** the righteous.
- 3. God <u>did not</u> spare the angels who rebelled.

4. God will judge those who are **foolishly fearless**, **rebellious**, **bold**, and **arrogant**.

## 3. False teachers must be resisted

- 1. Follow the **<u>pure</u>** <u>Word</u> <u>of</u> <u>God</u>.
- 2. Develop **<u>discernment</u>** with the assistance of the Holy Spirit.
- 3. <u>Do not</u> yield to ungodly influence. Ask—Does this appeal to my flesh or my spirit?
- 4. Look at the fruit of the teachers life and evaluate clearly.

5. Daily renew your commitment to follow God and say no to all sinful temptation immediately.

**Titus 2:11–14 (NIV84)**<sup>11</sup> For the <u>grace of God</u> that <u>brings salvation</u> has <u>appeared to all men</u>. <sup>12</sup> It teaches us to say <u>"No"</u> to <u>ungodliness</u> and <u>worldly passions</u>, and to <u>live self-controlled</u>, <u>upright</u> and <u>godly lives</u> in this present age, <sup>13</sup> <u>while we wait</u> for <u>the blessed hope</u>—the glorious appearing of our great God and Savior, <u>Jesus Christ</u>, <sup>14</sup> who <u>gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness</u> and to <u>purify for himself a people</u> that are his very own, <u>eager</u> to do what is good.
