

1 Peter 1—Stand firm in victory 1 Peter 2—Stand firm in your identity 1 Peter 3—Stand firm in your relationships 1 Peter 4—Stand firm in your faith 1 Peter 5—Stand firm against your adversary

1st Peter gives **<u>encouragement</u>** against outside persecution.

2nd Peter warns against inside corruption.

Corruption abounds when the Word of God is not the centerpiece of the church's function. To combat the problem of <u>heresy</u>, Peter reaffirmed the <u>foundation</u> of Holy Scripture. Second Peter is written to combat <u>false teaching</u> in the church.

Second Peter stresses the importance of <u>knowledge</u> using a form of that word 12 times. Second Peter validates the <u>inspiration</u> of scripture.

1. Knowing God intimately is the foundation of all blessings

2 Peter 1:1–4 (NIV84)¹ Simon Peter, a <u>servant</u> and <u>apostle</u> of Jesus Christ, To those who through the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ <u>have received a faith as precious as ours</u>: ² <u>Grace</u> and <u>peace</u> be yours in <u>abundance</u> through the <u>knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord</u>. ³ His divine power has given us <u>everything</u> we need for <u>life</u> and <u>godliness through our knowledge of him</u> <u>who called us</u> by his own glory and goodness. ⁴ Through these he has given us his very <u>great</u> and <u>precious promises</u>, so that through them <u>you may participate in the divine nature</u> and <u>escape the</u> <u>corruption in the world</u> caused by evil desires.

1. The entirety of blessings is based in <u>God's initiative</u> and come through a <u>heart knowledge</u> of Him.

2. All believers share a **<u>common</u>** faith in that we are equally saved, called, and equipped.

3. God's blessings are always abundant.

2. Knowing God intimately results in righteous behavior

2 Peter 1:5–11 (NIV84) ⁵ For this very reason, <u>make every effort to add to your faith goodness</u>; and to goodness, <u>knowledge</u>; ⁶ and to knowledge, <u>self-control</u>; and to self-control, <u>perseverance</u>; and to perseverance, <u>godliness</u>; ⁷ and to godliness, <u>brotherly kindness</u>; and to brotherly kindness, <u>love</u>. ⁸ For <u>if</u> you possess these qualities in increasing measure, <u>they will keep you from being ineffective and</u>

<u>unproductive</u> in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ But <u>if anyone does not have them</u>, he is <u>nearsighted and blind</u>, and <u>has forgotten that he has been cleansed from his past sins</u>. ¹⁰ Therefore, my brothers, <u>be all the more eager to make your calling and election sure</u>. For <u>if you do these things</u>, <u>you will never fall</u>, ¹¹ and <u>you will receive a rich welcome</u> into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Peter gives us seven steps we should follow in <u>diligently</u> building our spiritual lives of <u>faith</u>.
<u>Faith</u>-trusting God and remaining loyal to Him

a. goodness—moral excellence INTEGRITY

Good works are not the <u>root</u> of salvation (cause) but rather the <u>fruit</u> of salvation (result).

- b. <u>knowledge</u>—contrast knowledge and ignorance between spirit and flesh—WISDOM
- c. <u>self-control</u>—empowered by the Spirit
- d. <u>perseverance</u>—never quit, ever give up, never give in TENACITY
- e. godliness—living as a child of God. CANNOT be fabricated from human, effort requires God
- f. brotherly kindness—Phileo treating each other as dear family members
- g. <u>love</u>—Agape a deep commitment to another person's good
- This growth will positively impact your life substantially: a. <u>prevent</u> you from being <u>ineffective</u> and <u>unproductive</u>. b. you to <u>see clearly</u>. c. help you <u>remember your blessings</u>. d. <u>keep you from</u> <u>falling</u>. e. <u>provide a rich welcome</u> into God's Eternal Kingdom.

3. Knowing God intimately rests in divine revelation

2 Peter 1:12–21 (NIV84) ¹² So I will <u>always remind you of these things</u>, even though you know them and are <u>firmly established</u> in the truth you now have. ¹³ I think it is right to <u>refresh your memory</u> as long as I live in the tent of this body, ¹⁴ because I know that I will soon put it aside, as our Lord Jesus Christ has made clear to me. ¹⁵ And I will <u>make every effort</u> to see that after my departure you will <u>always</u> be able to <u>remember these things</u>. ¹⁶ We did not follow cleverly invented stories when we told you about the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ For he received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." ¹⁸ <u>We ourselves heard this voice</u> that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain. ¹⁹ And <u>we</u> have the word of the prophets made more certain, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. ²⁰ Above all, you must understand that <u>no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own</u> interpretation. ²¹ For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but <u>men spoke from God as</u> they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

- 1. We must **persistently proclaim** the truth of **the gospel**.
- 2. We must embrace our **<u>testimony</u>**.
- 3. We must value the Word of God as <u>divine</u>.
