



The day the infinite one became an infant

Inconceivable means impossible to imagine or think of

Inconceivable also means impossible to comprehend or grasp fully

Inconceivable can also be used to describe something that is extremely unlikely or so unlikely or surprising as to have been thought impossible.

1. John wrote his gospel with two purposes in mind: a.) to prove that Jesus is the Son of God and b.) to invite people to believe in Him and be saved. John 20:30-31
2. The proof for the deity of Jesus is found in His miracles, His words, and the testimony of believers.
3. Jesus entered our world as a unique being—fully God and fully man.
4. The greatest need of man was met in the incarnation. The birth of Jesus was the beginning of restoration between God and man.
5. Solomon articulated this shocking reality of God dwelling on earth when he dedicated the Temple in 1 Kings 8:27. *"But will God indeed dwell on the earth? Behold, heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain you; how much less this house that I have built!"*
6. The greatest miracle of all time happened when the infinite one became an infant.

1. Jesus is God

John 1:1–9 (NLT) ¹ *In the beginning the Word already existed. The Word was with God, and the Word was God.* ² *He existed in the beginning with God.* ³ *God created everything through him, and nothing was created except through him.* ⁴ *The Word gave life to everything that was created, and his life brought light to everyone.* ⁵ *The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it.* ⁶ *God sent a man, John the Baptist,* ⁷ *to tell about the light so that everyone might believe because of his testimony.* ⁸ *John himself was not the light; he was simply a witness to tell about the light.*

1. Jesus is eternally existent.
2. Jesus is eternally in relationship with the Father and Holy Spirit.
3. Jesus is the eternal God.
4. Jesus is the eternal Creator.
5. Jesus is the eternal source of life.
6. Jesus is the eternal source of light.

2. Jesus came into the World

⁹ *The one who is the true light, who gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.*

¹⁰ *He came into the very world he created, but the world didn't recognize him.* ¹¹ *He came to his own people, and even they rejected him.* ¹² *But to all who believed him and accepted him, he gave the right to become children of God.* ¹³ *They are reborn—not with a physical birth resulting from human passion or plan, but a birth that comes from God.*

1. Jesus is the full revelation of God.
2. Jesus was rejected by His own people.
3. Most loved to live in the darkness because of their evil.

John 3:19 (ESV) *And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil.*

4. Everyone who believes Him and accepts Him become a child of God.

3. Jesus came to provide grace

¹⁴ *So the Word became human and made his home among us. He was full of unfailing love and faithfulness. And we have seen his glory, the glory of the Father's one and only Son.* ¹⁵ *John testified about him when he shouted to the crowds, "This is the one I was talking about when I said, 'Someone is coming after me who is far greater than I am, for he existed long before me.' "* ¹⁶ *From his abundance we have all received one gracious blessing after another.* ¹⁷ *For the law was given through Moses, but God's unfailing love and faithfulness came through Jesus Christ.* ¹⁸ *No one has ever seen God. But the unique One, who is himself God, is near to the Father's heart. He has revealed God to us.*

1. Jesus became like us and lived with us.
2. Jesus was filled with unfailing love and faithfulness.
3. Jesus abundantly supplies all our needs by His grace.
4. Jesus revealed the fullness of God to us.
