Examples of a Clutter-Free Life

Vault verse for the month: Hebrews 12:1–2 (NLT)¹ Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, <u>let us strip off every weight that slows us</u> <u>down</u>, <u>especially</u> the sin that so easily trips us up</u>. And <u>let us run with endurance</u> the race God has set before us. ² <u>We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus</u>, the champion who <u>initiates</u> and <u>perfects</u> our faith. Because of the joy awaiting him, <u>he endured the cross</u>, disregarding its shame. <u>Now</u> he is seated <u>in the place of honor</u> beside God's throne.

- Spiritual clutter is the <u>accumulation</u> of anything that <u>hinders</u> or <u>distracts</u> from the pursuit of pleasing God.
- 2. The very things God intended to **bless** us are the things the devil wants to use to **harm** us.
- 3. When we emphasize the **temporary** rather than the eternal, we collect clutter.
- 4. The Bible is written with *instructions*, *illustrations*, and *examples*.
- 5. The examples of scripture fall into two categories—examples to <u>follow</u> and examples to <u>avoid</u>.
- 6. The **<u>examples</u>** scattered through the scriptures lead us toward a clutter-free life.

1. <u>Joseph</u> when he refused the temptation of Potiphar's wife Gen 37-39

1. Joseph's life was filled with <u>wild swings</u> of circumstances.

Favored son—<u>despised</u> brother—<u>purchased</u> slave—<u>favored</u> servant desired man—<mark>forsaken</mark> prisoner—<u>restored</u> leader—<u>providing</u> sibling reunited family member

2. The constant through all these times was his <u>devotion</u> to God.

2. <u>Daniel</u> was known for his daily habit of prayer

Daniel 6

- 1. Daniel was regarded as the **most competent** of all the leaders.
- 2. Daniel was known for his **<u>daily</u>** prayers to God.
- 3. The key to success in life is not what you do **<u>occasionally</u>** but what you do **<u>regularly</u>**.

"Champions do daily what others do occasionally." Neil Kennedy

4. Daniel faced **severe** punishment for his **<u>commitment</u>** to prayer.

3. Peter and John declared the gospel of Jesus boldly

Acts 4

- 1. God had worked **powerfully** in the Church using Peter as the primary speaker.
- 2. Peter and John were arrested for preaching the truth.
- They were unwavering in their <u>conviction</u>.

4. Saul Paul was transformed by an encounter with Jesus

Acts 9

- 1. Saul was a chief **persecutor** of Christians.
- 2. Jesus literally stopped Saul in his tracks.
- 3. Saul was so completely transformed that even his name was changed to Paul.

4. From that day forward Paul's life could be summed up by his **profession** in Philippians 4. **Philippians 3:13–14 (NLT)** ¹³ No, dear brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it, but <u>I focus on</u> <u>this one thing</u>: <u>Forgetting the past</u> and <u>looking forward to what lies ahead</u>, ¹⁴ <u>I press on</u> to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us.

5. Paul and Silas sing through the pain

Acts 16

- 1. Paul and Silas were **preaching** the gospel and bringing **<u>deliverance</u>** to sinners.
- 2. The sinners did not want to be delivered.
- 3. Paul and Silas were in a <u>dark</u>, <u>damp</u>, <u>cold</u>, <u>confined</u> place of <u>punishment</u> for <u>doing good</u>.
- 4. They were singing **<u>before</u>** God provided their freedom.
- 5. Paul and Silas were marked by joyful worship even in difficult times.

6. The entire life of Jesus was marked by intentional actions

- 1. His birth, his miracles, his ministry, and even his death were in <u>complete obedience</u> to the will of the Father.
- 2. Nothing of value happens by chance. (Accidents happen without preparation.)
- 3. The major focus of his life was to **bridge the gap** between man and God.
- 4. His **<u>obedience</u>** caused his death.
- 5. His obedience secured our victory.
- 6. Jesus' life was marked by an unwavering perseverance.
