Vault verse for February: Colossians 3:13 (NLT) <u>Make allowance</u> for each other's <u>faults</u>, and <u>forgive anyone who offends you</u>. <u>Remember</u>, <u>the Lord forgave you</u>, <u>so you must</u> forgive others</u>.

- 1. Developing the ability to overlook an offense is a mark of **maturity**.
- 2. <u>Using an offense</u> to provide an <u>opportunity for personal growth</u> is a rare quality with incredible blessing.
- 3. You can see challenging seasons of life or challenging people in one of three ways:
 - a. obstacles to be avoided at all costs
 - b. problems to tolerate, endure and hope to survive
 - c. opportunities to <u>learn</u>, <u>grow</u>, <u>develop</u>, and share in the sufferings of Jesus
- 4. The key to success managing an offense is to be filled with grace.

1. Difficulty is common for everyone

1 Peter 4:12–15 (NLT) ¹² Dear friends, don't be surprised at the fiery trials you are going through, as if something strange were happening to you

1. God did not promise <u>avoidance</u> of problems—He promises His presence and His <u>assistance</u>. Isaiah 43:1–3 (NLT) ¹ But now, O Jacob, listen to the LORD who created you. O Israel, the one who formed you says, "Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are mine. ² When you go through deep waters, <u>I will be with you</u>. When you go through rivers of difficulty, you will not drown. When you walk through the fire of oppression, you will not be burned up; the flames will not consume you. ³ For I am the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.

Isaiah 41:10 (NLT) Don't be afraid, <u>for I am with you</u>. Don't be discouraged, for I am your God. <u>I</u> <u>will strengthen you and help you</u>. <u>I will hold you up</u> with my victorious right hand.

2. God wants to use your problems for your <u>development</u>.

James 1:2–4 (NLT) ² Dear brothers and sisters, <u>when troubles of any kind come</u> your way, <u>consider it an opportunity for great joy</u>. ³ For you know that <u>when your faith is tested</u>, <u>your</u> <u>endurance has a chance to grow</u>. ⁴ So <u>let it grow</u>, for <u>when your endurance is fully developed</u>, <u>you will be perfect and complete</u>, <u>needing nothing</u>.

Romans 5:3–4 (NLT) ³ We can <u>rejoice</u>, too, <u>when we run into problems and trials</u>, for we know that t<u>hey help us develop endurance</u>. ⁴ And endurance develops <u>strength of character</u>, and character strengthens our <u>confident hope of salvation</u>.

3. The way you respond to your problems affects your **<u>future</u>**.

Hebrews 12:11 (NLT) <u>No discipline is enjoyable</u> <u>while it is happening</u>—it's painful! But <u>afterward</u> there will be <u>a peaceful harvest of right living</u> for those who are trained in this way.

4. Face difficult in life with **prayer**, **trust**, **devotion**, and **joy**. Rom 12:12 Phil 4:6-7 Pro 3:5-6 2 Cor 4:17

2. Difficult people develop your character

- 1. <u>Goliath</u> gave the opportunity for David's courage to be seen.
- 2. <u>Pharaoh</u> pushed Moses to be the deliverer of Israel.
- 3. <u>Haman</u> caused Esther to approach the King on behalf of her people, the Jews.
- 4. <u>Potiphar's wife</u> caused Joseph to go to prison so he could interpret dreams and eventually manage Egypt and provide food for the Israelites during famine.
- 5. The betrayal of <u>Judas</u> sent Jesus to the cross to be the Lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world.
- 6. Don't get bitter over a conflict even if the other person opposes you as an enemy.
- Enemies can be used of God to push us to pray, rely on Him, and become our best with His help. God is working in all things!!!
- 8. Treat those who oppose you **<u>biblically</u>**.

Luke 6:27–31 (NLT) ²⁷ "But to you who are willing to listen, I say, <u>love your enemies</u>! <u>Do good to</u> <u>those who hate you.</u> ²⁸ <u>Bless those who curse you</u>. <u>Pray for those who hurt you</u>. ²⁹ If someone slaps you on one cheek, offer the other cheek also. If someone demands your coat, offer your shirt also. ³⁰ Give to anyone who asks; and when things are taken away from you, don't try to get them back. ³¹ <u>Do to others as you would like them to do to you.</u>

Romans 12:19–21 (NLT) ¹⁹ Dear friends, never take revenge. Leave that to the righteous anger of God. For the Scriptures say, "I will take revenge; I will pay them back," says the LORD. ²⁰ Instead, "I<u>f your enemies are hungry, feed them</u>. <u>If they are thirsty, give them something to drink.</u> In doing this, you will heap burning coals of shame on their heads." ²¹ <u>Don't let evil conquer you,</u> <u>but conquer evil by doing good.</u>

1 Peter 3:9 (NLT) ⁹ <u>Don't repay evil for evil</u>. <u>Don't retaliate with insults when people insult you</u>. Instead, **pay them back with a blessing**. That is what <u>God has called you to do</u>, and <u>he will grant</u> <u>you his blessing</u>.

Romans 8:16–18 (ESV) ¹⁶ The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him. ¹⁸ For <u>I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us</u>.
