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Ensuring the Church as a House of Growth

Vault verse for this series: Hebrews 10:24–25 (NLT)²⁴ Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. ²⁵ And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near. 1. God's word encourages faithful participation with other believers.

2. The early church came together daily.

Acts 2:42–47 (NLT) ⁴² All the believers <u>devoted</u> themselves to the apostles' <u>teaching</u>, and to <u>fellowship</u>, and to <u>sharing</u> in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to <u>prayer</u>. ⁴³ A <u>deep sense</u> <u>of awe</u> came over them all, and the apostles performed many <u>miraculous signs and wonders</u>. ⁴⁴ And <u>all the believers</u> met together in <u>one place</u> and <u>shared everything they had</u>. ⁴⁵ They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. ⁴⁶ They <u>worshiped</u> <u>together at the Temple each day</u>, <u>met in homes for the Lord's Supper</u>, and shared their meals with <u>great joy</u> and <u>generosity</u>—⁴⁷ all the while <u>praising God</u> and <u>enjoying the goodwill of all</u> <u>the people</u>. And <u>each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved</u>.

3. The church <u>must</u> be a place that inspires, encourages, equips, and promotes continual personal growth.

Ephesians 4:11–16 (NLT) ¹¹ Now these are <u>the gifts Christ gave to the church</u>: the <u>apostles</u>, the <u>prophets</u>, the <u>evangelists</u>, and the <u>pastors</u> and <u>teachers</u>. ¹² <u>Their responsibility is to equip God's</u> <u>people to do his work and build up the church</u>, the body of Christ. ¹³ <u>This will continue</u> until we all come to such <u>unity in our faith</u> and <u>knowledge of God's Son</u> <u>that we will be mature in the</u> <u>Lord</u>, measuring up to the full and complete standard of Christ. ¹⁴ Then we will <u>no longer be</u> <u>immature like children</u>. We won't be tossed and blown about by every wind of new teaching. We will not be influenced when people try to trick us with lies so clever they sound like the truth. ¹⁵ Instead, we will speak the truth in love, <u>growing in every way more and more like Christ</u>, who is the head of his body, the church. ¹⁶ He makes the whole body fit together perfectly. <u>As each</u> <u>part does its own special work</u>, <u>it helps the other parts grow</u>, <u>so that the whole body is healthy</u> <u>and growing and full of love</u>.

4. Every Christian church should be a continually **growing disciple** of Jesus.

5.Growth **<u>begins</u>** when we are saved.

1 Peter 2:1–3 (NLT) ¹ So get rid of all evil behavior. Be done with all deceit, hypocrisy, jealousy, and all unkind speech. ² Like newborn babies, you must <u>crave pure spiritual milk</u> <u>so that</u> you will <u>grow into a full experience of salvation</u>. <u>Cry out for this nourishment</u>, ³ now that you have had a taste of the Lord's kindness.

6. Spiritual growth is the mark of a mature saint.

Psalm 92:12–14 (NLT) ¹² But <u>the godly will</u> flourish like palm trees and <u>grow strong like the</u> <u>cedars of Lebanon</u>. ¹³ For they are transplanted to the LORD's own house</u>. They flourish in the courts of our God. ¹⁴ Even in old age they will still produce fruit; they will remain vital and <u>green</u>.

1. You should be growing and developing in all areas of life

Luke 2:52 (NLT) Jesus grew in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and all the people.

- 1. <u>Spiritual growth</u>—Growing in faith, trust, and reliance on God's promises through prayer, worship, study of the Word, and participation in ministry.
- 2. <u>Character growth</u>—We are to act like Jesus more every day.
- 3. <u>Relational growth</u>—Cultivating healthy and loving relationships by practicing forgiveness, grace, and compassion. Building unity and fellowship within the body of Christ.
- 4. <u>Mental and Emotional growth</u>—Cultivating peace and joy, renewing your mind by focusing on God's truth, overcoming fear, doubt, and distractions.
- 5. <u>Stewardship growth</u>—Learning to manage time, talent, and resources for God's glory. Practicing generosity and faithfulness.
- 6. <u>Endurance growth</u>—Standing firm in the face of trials, growing stronger, and trusting God.

2. Personal growth is the result of intentional effort

Salvation is instantaneous but personal growth requires a lifetime of devotion.

- 1. Digesting the **Word of God**.
- 2. Connecting with others for mutual benefit.
- 3. Fostering intimacy with God through prayer and worship.
- 4. Maturing in character by yielding to the Holy Spirit's activity in your life.
- 5. Focusing on **responsibility** and **opportunity** to advance God's work through **serving** and **sharing**.
- 6. Developing the mind of Christ will guard against cynicism, discouragement, and compromise.

3. Lack of spiritual growth has catastrophic results

- 1. **Spiritual stagnation and immaturity** are the result of limited or no growth.
- 2. Lack of growth results in vulnerability to **<u>temptation</u>**.
- 3. Lack of growth **diminishes** your spiritual effectiveness.

The three major hinderances in the church are *immaturity*, *insecurity*, and *irresponsibility*.

2 Peter 3:18 (NLT) Rather, you must grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. All glory to him, both now and forever! Amen.
