# MOSES—THE DIVERSE HERC

## **Vault verse for this series: Philippians 3:17 (ESV)** *Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us.*

- 1. Moses is mentioned in the Old Testament 767 times and 85 times in the New Testament.
- 2. He is mentioned in 27 of the 66 books of the Bible.
- 3. He is known for extraordinary accomplishments and is one of the most significant characters in the Bible. Deut. 34:10-12
- 4. His leadership is pivotal to the history of Israel.
- 5. He was a statesman, historian, judge, commander, prophet, author, teacher, lawgiver, and intercessor.
- 6. He lived for 120 years and had good vision and full strength when he died. Deut. 34:7.
- 7. His life can be easily divided into three sections of 40 years each.

## 1. Moses was a prince in Egypt (first 40 years) development

#### Exodus 2:1-10 Acts 7:20-22 Hebrews 11:24-26

- 1. Moses was born into slavery. The Israelites were slaves to Egypt for 430 years. Ex 12:40.
- 2. Pharaoh had commanded that every Jewish newborn boy to be thrown into the Nile River.
- 3. When Moses was born his mother placed him in a waterproof basket and placed it in the Nile.
- 4. Pharaoh's daughter saw the basket and heard Moses crying and felt sorry for him.
- 5. Moses became the son of Pharaoh's daughter.
- 6. Miriam, the sister of Moses, was at the Nile whin Moses was discovered and offered to find a Hebrew woman to care for Moses during the first years of life.
- 7. Moses was raised with an understanding of his Hebrew culture and wanted to help his people.
- 8. Moses was raised with all of the benefits of being a son of Pharaoh's daughter.

Acts 7:22 (ESV) And Moses was instructed in all the wisdom of the Egyptians, and he was mighty in his words and deeds.

**Hebrews 11:24–26 (ESV)**<sup>24</sup> By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, <sup>25</sup> choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. <sup>26</sup> He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward.

9. Moses saw an Egyptian abusing a Hebrew slave and took matters into his own hands killing

the Egyptian hiding his body in the sand. Prov 28:13

10. Moses had to flee the palace and headed toward Midian. A journey of more than 400 miles.

## 2. Moses was a shepherd in Midian (second 40 years) resolution

Exodus 2:11-21 Acts 7:23-29 Heb 11:27

- 1. Moses arrives in Midian and immediately gets into another altercation.
- 2. Moses rescues the daughters of the priest of Midian and is welcomed into the family.
- 3. For 40 years Moses was a shepherd for the flocks of his father-in-law.
- 4. He marries Zipporah and they have two sons Gershom (a stranger there) and Eliezer (my God is my help) Acts 7:29–30 (ESV)<sup>29</sup> At this retort Moses fled and became an exile in the land of Midian, where he became the father of two sons. <sup>30</sup> "Now when forty years had passed, an angel appeared to him in the wilderness of Mount Sinai, in a flame of fire in a bush.
- 5. Moses spent forty years in character refinement. He grew in humility, determination, alertness, and perseverance.

### 3. Moses was the leader of Israel (last 40 years) accomplishment

Exodus 3-40 Numbers, Deuteronomy Acts 7:30-36 Heb 11:28-29

- 1. The King of Egypt who sought to kill Moses dies.
- 2. Moses is now 80 years old when God places an assignment on his life in the desert using a burning bush to attract his attention.

**Exodus 3:4-8a** <sup>7</sup> Then the Lord told him. I have certainly <u>seen the oppression of my peopl</u>e in Egypt. I have <u>heard their cries of distress</u> because of their harsh slave drivers. Yes, <u>I am aware</u> <u>of their suffering</u>. <sup>8</sup> <u>So I have come down to rescue them</u> from the power of the Egyptians and lead them out of Egypt into their own fertile and spacious land.

- 3. Moses states four reasons he can't be the person God uses. Exodus 3:11-4:17.
- a. He doubts his worth, (Gods answer-I will be with you) b. fears rejection of the people, c. questions his ability and finally d. pleas for <u>anyone else</u> to be chosen. Moses is reluctant!!!
- 4. Moses and Aaron return to Egypt and meet with the elders.
- 5. Moses places ten plagues on the Egyptians while pleading for freedom.
- 6. They are released after the 10<sup>th</sup> plague and Moses leads the people out of Egypt.
- 7. Moses begins the journey of freedom organizing them into a nation and teaching them to know and follow God.
- 8. Moses faithfully led the people even though they were often angry with him.
- 9. Moses was prevented from entering the promised land because of his disobedience to God.
- 10. Moses' life was marked by providence, perseverance, faith, wisdom, obedience, courage, and developed skill.
